



## Applying for Import Permission INTERNATIONAL SPORTS SHOOTER

### International Sports Shooter Test

Under this test, sports shooters who are not Australian citizens may apply to import a restricted category C firearm solely to take part in a clay target event. A restricted category C firearm is a self-loading shotgun or a pump action repeating shotgun. The event must be:

- an Olympic Games or an associated event; or
- a Paralympic Games or an associated event; or
- a Commonwealth Games or an associated event; or
- an event organised by the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA).

### Who can apply?

Sports shooters who are not Australian citizens.

### Import Conditions

The sports shooter is licensed or authorised in the State or Territory that they will be competing in.

The sports shooter must also obtain permission to export the firearm/s from the Department of Defence. The firearm/s must be exported (or destroyed) within the time specified on the import permit.

### HOW TO APPLY

Applications must be made in writing to the Attorney-General's Department.

#### Required Supporting Documentation

- 1. Completed application form including details of article to be imported, the reason for importation and the date of import.
- 2. Evidence of competition:
  - ⇒ Copy of invitation; or
  - ⇒ Copy of official entry confirmation; or
  - ⇒ A statement from organisers that the sports shooter will participate in the event;

**and**

- ⇒ Statement from the organisers the event is:
  - the Olympic Games or an associated event; or
  - the Paralympic Games or an associated event; or
  - the Commonwealth Games or an associated event; or
  - organised by ACTA.
- 3. Evidence the sports shooter is not an Australian Citizen or resident:
  - ⇒ Certified copy of passport; or
  - ⇒ Certified copy of visa/permit for Australia.
- 4. Evidence of license or authorisation to possess firearm/s:
  - ⇒ Certified copy of license or permit from State/Territory authority.
